Alfred & Ada Salter

Catherine & I have almost finished walking 'The Thames Path', and last Saturday came across a group of statues with a fascinating story that I had not come across before.

Ada Brown (1866 to 1942) was born in Northamptonshire. At 30, she left her well-off home in Raunds to do social work in the London slums as a Methodist 'Sister of the People'.



Alfred Salter (1873 to 1945), was born in Greenwich and reckoned the most brilliant student Guys Hospital ever produced. He was a bacteriologist with a great career ahead of him when in 1898, also stirred by social conscience, he arrived at the Methodist Bermondsey Settlement where Ada was working. The settlement had been set up in this area of widespread poverty to improve the working conditions and lives of the local people.

In 1900 the two married, became Quakers, had a daughter Joyce, were active in politics, and dedicated their lives to the impoverished people of Bermondsey and Rotherhithe.

Ada's concern for working women led to her election in 1909 as the first Woman councillor in Bermondsey and first Labour woman councillor in London. To counter dire conditions in some local factories Ada recruited women to trades unions. This bore fruit during the Bermondsey Uprising of 1911 when thousands of women went on strike. After Ada organised food supplies for their starving families she was honoured by the trade union movement and in 1914 elected National President of the Women's Labour League.

Since we last met the lights to Rooms 1-5, kitchen, toilets, lobby to accessible toilet and the carpeted link from the vestibule to the main corridor have all been converted to automatic movement sensor switching. As you enter the area and the light turns on and turns off when no further movement has been detected. The redundant switches have been removed and replaced with cover plates on which notices advising this change have been placed. All other areas remain with manual switches.

WORSHIPPING WITH THE HARROW & HILLINGDON METHODIST CIRCUIT VIA ZOOM

We are delighted and privileged to be able to offer an opportunity for those people across the circuit and beyond who want to worship together on-line as our churches start to reopen their buildings. Worship via Zoom has its limitation, especially the inability to sing together (due to the impact of differential internet delays 😞), however it does provide an opportunity people across the circuit who can't / don't want to return to worship in their church buildings to worship together.

If you are planning to join us for the first time, especially if you haven't used Zoom before, it might be helpful for you to know:

- 1) In order to access the service you should just (depending on the type of device you're using) need to click the link in the invitation e-mail, although you will need to be let in by the Host (The invitation e-mail also includes a Zoom meeting ID and passcode in case you're asked for these.)
- 2) If prompted to "Open Zoom Meetings", "Join with video" or "Join with computer audio" please click to accept these options.
- 3) If you join before 10:45 am, you will discover us greeting one another and checking that those people who are going to be participating in the service have connected successfully. At 10:45am the Host will mute everyone apart from the leader.
- 4) The service will be led by one of the circuit preachers or a combination of the worship leaders who are worshipping with us via Zoom.
- 5) The service will follow a structure similar to a normal Methodist service but with fewer hymns / songs (usually just 2 or 3) due to the fact that it's not possible to literally sing together and shorter "reflections" rather than a longer sermon.
- 6) The approach we are using for singing hymns / songs is to ask everyone to access YouTube videos of performances of the hymn / song (with lyrics). The easiest way to access these is to **click on the links in the Zoom Chat at the appropriate point in the service**. (The links are also included in the Order of Service sent out with the invitation e-mail in case you want to access the videos before or after the service. To access the Chat function, click on the "Chat" button at the bottom of your screen*.) We try to avoid selecting videos that have an advert at the beginning but sometime this isn't possible so, if there is an advert at the start of the video, please click on the "Skip ads" button that comes up in the bottom right hand corner of the screen after a few seconds. Once the singing starts, please sing along, knowing that everyone else attending the service is doing likewise on their own. When the video ends please either pause it or close your browser window (to avoid YouTube playing another video) and then return to Zoom by clicking on the Zoom icon (a white camera on a blue background: ) in the toolbar at the bottom of your screen if you're on a PC.
- 7) At the end of service, we are experimenting with "virtual tea and coffee" in Zoom Break Out rooms, to which people will be allocated randomly in groups of 5 or 6. Please check that you are unmuted (by clicking on the "Unmute" icon in the bottom left hand corner of your screen* if the microphone symbol has a red line through it). When you've finished, just click the red "Leave meeting" button on right hand side at the bottom of your screen.

* To see the Zoom toolbar which these buttons are on, you may need to move your mouse (if using a PC) / touch the screen (if using a phone.)
