At the moment, social distancing has restricted the number of seats available in the body of the church and although Demand for seats, at this particular service, is liable to be high, so early booking is recommended. We would not wish anyone to be disappointed so, thanks to the hard work of the AV team, the service can now be transmitted virtually live (just a few seconds' delay) to the church hall; if you cannot be accommodated in the main church you may be able to attend the service in this 'overflow' facility...or, of course, you may prefer to join the live streamed service in the comfort of your own home; using the like above.

We are delighted that the Discoverers are now back to meeting in the church hall and, although they aren't yet able to join us at the start of the weekly service, it's good to know they're not far away. If you've not yet returned to church in person for Sunday morning worship, you might be interested to hear how we're dealing with arrangements at the moment...

Entry is via the Torrington Road glass doors and you are greeted by one of the Welcome Stewards. You are asked to wear a mask indoors, and a hand sanitising machine is provided just inside the door. Seating has been allocated in advance so you are led to your allocated, numbered seat/s. You are asked not to move around more than essential, once seated. Seating inside the church has been very carefully measured out, to ensure social distancing guidance is followed. The heating comes on before the service, to warm the church but, as it is a blown air system, it turns off as people arrive and the church windows are then opened to provide ventilation, as recommended. Consequently, it is recommended you dress warmly – although this doesn't appear to have caused any major issues so far! A one-way system is in place inside the building - you enter via the concertina doors and exit via the double doors. The toilets are available, also following a one-way system via the coffee lounge doors and returning via the "coats' corridor". At the end of the service, you are shown out of the church via the Ashburton Rd doors, unless you are unable to manage the steps, in which case you may exit via the Torrington Rd doors. The preacher usually stands just outside to say goodbye and we are asked not to congregate (excuse the pun!) at the doorway, to enable others to pass at a safe distance. We are not currently allowed to offer refreshments at the end of the service, nor to sing hymns but some preachers have encouraged us to hum along with the hymns, which are shown as YouTube clips!

I hope that gives some reassurance, if you are thinking of returning but were unsure what to expect. As always, if you are in a 'vulnerable' group, the advice is not to attend public worship and we want everyone to feel safe. Obviously if you have any symptoms or feel unwell, please stay at home. Due to social distancing, there is less seating available than usual - but so far we've been able to accommodate all those who have wished to join us.
