# **Bookings and Covid precautions - IMPORTANT INFO SO PLEASE READ!**

The Stewards, Dong and Safeguarding Officers have reviewed the situation as promised...

At RMMC, whilst a formal 'poll' hasn't been taken, it appears that most people attending services have been content with our precautions, many continuing to keep on their masks throughout the service anyway. So, it has been decided ...

that we continue our current precautions - ventilation, sanitising hands, social distancing and masks unless exempt (which, **if desired**, may be removed when seated, **EXCEPT** for those who are not vaccinated). AS WE ARE NO LONGER BOOKING ALLOCATED SEATS, PLEASE MAKE SURE YOU SIT 4 CHAIRS APART FROM OTHERS AND NOT IN BLOCKED ROWS OR ON CHAIRS MARKED WITH A X.

that, in a building as small as ours, there's not really a lot of point in providing mask-wearing and non-mask wearing areas.

that, as there hasn't been any necessity to turn away anyone from services, we will dispense with the requirement for booking (EXCEPT FOR CHRISTMAS SERVICES) but leave the seats as they are, with blocked rows, crosses and numbers; this is to encourage continued social distancing. that, for the likely-better-attended Christmas services, we ask people to book. Details will, of course, appear in newsletters and in the church website.

# Please note the correct date for decorating the Christmas Tree is Tuesday, 7th December 2021.

Christmas seems to be approaching at light speed...at RMMC, we will have the usual Advent wreath ready for the first Sunday in Advent (28th November). It is proposed to decorate the church and erect and decorate the <u>Christmas tree</u> on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>7th December 2021</u>, <u>commencing 10am</u>. A team of half a dozen or so will be needed, so if you are able to help, please let Eileen know.

In order to include as many as possible of the people who use our premises - church members (including those not yet returned to worship in person), Discovers, groups using the premises - everyone is invited to make a <u>STAR</u> to be used in the church decorations. The stars may be made from any medium - paper, card, fabric, wire... and decorated any way you like - tinsel, sequins etc etc. Let creativity run riot! Each star should be no larger than 8" (20cm) diameter. Completed stars may be posted to the church or left on a table in the church lobby, no later than 7th December. It would be wonderful to have a whole firmament of stars, so do participate!

<u>Knitted Tree</u> - In addition to the usual tree, this year we'll have a second tree - created from different coloured knitted squares, contributed by several knitters. These squares will be joined together after Christmas to form a blanket/s for charity. (It's not too late to contribute, knitted or crochet 5.5" squares - instructions available from Nola).

Christmas Cards - due to lockdown, we were unable, last year, to offer the usual Christmas card rack, for distribution of cards to church friends. This year - although a slightly different arrangement - you will be able to 'post' your cards for church friends at church. From this Sunday onwards a red box will be positioned in the coffee lounge - no need for you to sort them - please place all your cards in this 'post box' on your way in to church; cards will be sorted alphabetically (and into family group bundles) during the service and, to promote social distancing, they'll be arranged in alphabetical order on a table/s in the coffee lounge. Please collect any cards for your family at the end of the service, avoiding 'bunching' around the table. Any leftover cards each week will be placed in the card rack until the following week. Last 'posting date' is the 5pm Nativity service on 19th December - any cards not collected by 19th December will need to be hand delivered or, where necessary, posted - so help with delivery will be appreciated and, obviously, please only use the RMMC card service for those attending RMMC!!!

"Karibuni Children started with Corinne Murphy (daughter of our former Superintendent Bill Murphy) opening a bank account with £2.56. She had been inspired to do something about the children she had seen living in the slums and on the streets of Kenya." ... The trustees have been unable to visit the projects that they support in Kenya but have used Zoom to keep in touch. In response to the initial lock-down in Kenya in April 2020, Karibuni Children providing monthly food parcels for sponsored children and their families. This was followed up with grants to enable projects to purchase items needed to help children undertake distance learning, ranging from computer tablets to solar radios. The charity was able to respond as it had strong financial reserves due to legacies in wills that they had received and the generosity of their supporters.


This week we pray for everyone at Pinner Methodist Church
