SO, WHAT IS THIS 'ANGEL DUSTING' ALL ABOUT?

After a number of knitted angels were produced for last year's sanctuary angel decorations, Julie suggested these might be added to and used this year for 'Angel Dusting'. The idea of 'Angel Dusting' is to place small, hand-made angels around the area, to be taken, free of charge, as a gift from us to them – people who are not connected to RMMC; this raises the profile of the church in the local community and demonstrates and reinforces the message, which just happens to be this year's Methodist Christmas theme! Members of the (Tuesday) Craft Group, with input from some members of the Knit & Natter group, have knitted and stitched additional angels and are planning to have 50 angels to hang on the church fence in early December, for local people, not connected to RMMC, to take.
